Assistance SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program)

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) provides a monthly benefit for the purchase of food items through an Electronic Benefits Transfer Card (EBT). The card is used at participating supermarkets and convenience stores. The monthly amount depends on income and family size.
