CHILD CARE ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

Child Care Assistance Program (CCAP)

Child Care Assistance is available to Families who meet income guidelines and are working a minimum of 20 hours per week at or above Rhode Island's minimum wage. The CCAP will help pay child care costs to providers who meet certain criteria. The family may be required to make a co-payment based on the household income and family size.

Head Start and Early Head Start

Head Start and Early Head Start are federally funded programs designed to improve the school readiness of children in low income families. Services provided include education, health, dental health, mental health and nutrition. In addition, the programs provide services for families including intensive social services, parent education programs, housing assistance and adult education. Both Head Start and Early Head Start focus on the entire family, not just the child.

- Head Start serves low income children and their families two years prior to kindergarten entry.
- Early Head Start serves low income pregnant women and children from birth to age3.
