Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)

Heating System Repair/Replacement

The Heating System Repair Program may provide a one-time service to increase the heating system efficiency of owner-occupied income eligible households. In instances where heating systems cannot be made efficient and if a system meets certain requirements, the heating system may be replaced.

Appliance Management Program (AMP)

If your household qualifies for LIHEAP, then you also qualify for a home visit with a CAP auditor who will review the electric bills and energy use. The auditor will give ideas to help save energy and money as well as replace inefficient lightbulbs and certain appliances.
